

# Faculty Process/Status

The DAC has recommended to the Chancellor that the Petition be approved and have passed it on the Registrar in the Chancellor's office (lawyers in Telford) – theoretically end of DAC involvement	<i>Completed</i>
28-day public consultation – the notice is on the board for the public to send in objections to the Registrar	<i>Active</i>
We send in a certificate of compliance with the consultation to the Registrar	<i>Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> May</i>
The Registrar will send a copy of the objection(s) to us	<i>Completed</i>
The Registrar offers objector the opportunity (21 days lapse time) to be a "party opponent" of the Petition by filling in a form and thence being able to make a more detailed case 'before the court' which we can respond to – all gets a bit complicated and can start costing people money	<i>To be submitted by 8<sup>th</sup> June<sup>1</sup></i>
If the objector does not fill in the form (and almost all do not), they default to leaving the Chancellor to decide the merits based on their letter	
We have 21 days to respond to the objection	<i>Also 8<sup>th</sup> June</i>
The Chancellor then makes his decision based on the DAC recommendation, the letter of objection and our response to the objection – <i>another two weeks? – end June/mid-July?</i>	<i>2 Weeks ???</i>
